Relationship and Sexuality Education including Sexually Sensitive Issues Policy

Context: RSE is a **mandatory** part of SPHE for all classes. RSE will be delivered within the context of S.P.H.E. Sensitive issues will be covered within the strand units Taking care of my body, Growing and changing and Safety and protection.

Aims: The aims of social, personal and health education are:

To promote the personal development and well-being of the child

To foster in the child a sense of care and respect for him/herself and other and an appreciation of the dignity of every human being

To promote the health of the child and provide a foundation for health living in all its aspects

To enable the child to make informed decisions and choices about the social and personal and health dimensions of life both now and in the future.

To develop in the child a sense of social responsibility, and a commitment to the active and participative citizenship and an appreciation of the democratic way of life. To enable the child to respect human and cultural diversity and to appreciate and understand the interdependent nature of the world.

Management and Organisation

- Parents are acknowledged as primary educators of their children and teachers work in a supportive role
- Teachers' right to opt out from teaching the sensitive issues will be honoured
- Children with SEN should have a child protection target in their IEP and their needs should be considered when teaching Stay Safe and RSE eg. revisiting or longer time spent on them for the individual child
- All content objectives will be covered on rolling 2 year basis.(all content relevant to the year band)
- A parent's right to withdraw a pupil from the process will be honoured on the
 understanding that the parents are taking full responsibility for this aspect of
 education themselves. It is the responsibility of the parent to inform the school of
 this decision and for collecting and returning the child during this specific time.
 If a parent wishes to opt out, they will be invited in to go through the content and
 teacher will explain that the main reason for teaching RSE is to protect the child
 from abuse. If they still want to opt out they will be asked to put it in writing from
 and this will be kept on file.
- If parents choose to opt out of the lessons we cannot guarantee that their child will not hear the language taught in school from the other children or in other contexts as children may use it outside the lessons, or discuss the lessons.
- Should a pupil require information that is not in line with the curriculum content, and considered not to be age appropriate for the general body of pupils the school will refer the pupil to the parents/guardian
